[Boston, MA – July 20, 2018] – ArtsEmerson, Boston's leading presenter of contemporary world theatre, proudly welcomes Dead Centre's (Ireland) **Hamnet**, co-directed and co-written by Bush Moukarzel and Ben Kidd. A multimedia theatre experience, **Hamnet** brings Shakespeare's only son, who died at age 11 without knowing his famous father, to the stage. A riveting performance carried chiefly by a solo young actor confronts what it means—and what it costs—to be great. The production runs three weeks at the Emerson Paramount Center's Robert J. Orchard Stage, located at 559 Washington Street in downtown Boston. ArtsEmerson and Dead Centre will provide Boston audiences a final chance to see Ollie West perform in the role of 11 year old Hamnet who *The Guardian* calls "riveting [and] completely poised". The companies celebrate West's farewell performance as well as welcoming the young and talented Aran Murphy to take over the role of Hamnet in the final week of performances at the Emerson Paramount Center.

"It's a completely surprising, and deeply moving, contribution to the world of Shakespeare. In focusing on his son, a whole new portrait of the man emerges. And it's audacious, entrusting this emotionally complex story to the care of its young star. Dead Centre is a fresh and rising voice out of Ireland that is emerging on the world stage with this piece. It makes a perfect opening to our 9th season."

About Hamnet

Shakespeare's only son takes center stage. William Shakespeare had one son: Hamnet. While William was away working in London, Hamnet died at 11 years old without ever knowing his famous father. How do our dreams impact our families? Do adults really have it all figured out? Or are we blind to what we could have done better until it's too late? In **Hamnet**, a tour-de-force performance from a young actor confronts what it means—and what it costs—to be great, and how living in the shadow of that greatness can keep one in the dark. In this moving, meticulous, multimedia wonder, ambition clashes with family responsibilities in a way that rivals the stakes of a great Shakespearean tragedy. Running time: 60 minutes.

About Dead Centre

Dead Centre was founded by Bush Moukarzel and Ben Kidd in Dublin in 2012. Their first project **Souvenir** was created for Dublin Fringe Festival 2012 with guest performances following in 2013 in London and New York. **LIPPY** premiered in 2013 in Dublin and has since travelled to New York, Edinburgh, Glasgow, the Young Vic in London, and Schaubühne in Berlin. It was winner of the Irish Times Theatre Award for Best Production, a Fringe First, a Herald Angel, a Total Theatre Award and two OBI Awards. Chekhov's First Play premiered in late 2015, and has played in the Schaubühne, Mayfest (Bristol), Baltoscandal, TnBa (Bordeaux), Theatre Vidy and Brisbane Festival. Their most recent project, **Hamnet**, premiered at Schaubühne in F.I.N.D. Festival in April 2017.

Cast

Ollie West (Hamnet) Ollie first worked with Dead Centre on the development of **Chekhov's First Play** when he was eleven. When Bush decided not to cast a child for the full production, he made a promise that they would work together some day. The following year he wrote **Hamnet** for Ollie. They premiered at the Find Festival at the Schaubühne in Berlin and toured to Noorderzon Festival, Holland, Tramway in Glasgow, Dublin Theatre Festival and Southbank Centre in London. He was nominated for Best Actor in the Irish Times Theatre Awards 2018.

Aran Murphy (Hamnet) This is Aran Murphy's first professional play. He loves acting and football, he supports Liverpool.

Creative Team Bush Moukarzel

Master of Philosophy in Psychoanalytic Studies at Trinity College Dublin, Co-artistic director and co-founder of the Irish theatre group Dead Centre. Author, director and actor in various Dead Centre productions such as Souvenir (Dublin Fringe Festival, 2012) and LIPPY (Dublin Fringe Festival, 2013), both by Bush Moukarzel, (S)quark! (New Theatre, Dublin, 2013), Chekhov's First Play based on Anto Chekhov (Dublin Theatre Festival, 2015) and Hamnet based on William Shakespeare, Ben Kidd and Bush Moukarzel (Co-Production of Dead Centre and Abbey Theatre, Schaubühne, 2017). He worked with theatre companies such as Painted Filly Theatre, Rough Magic Theatre and Druid Theatre Company and toured extensively with the Pan Pan theatre company performing in **Oedipus Loves You** by Simon Doyle and Gavin Quinn (Dublin Theatre Festival, 2005), The Idiots by Lars von Trier (Dublin International Theatre Festival, 2007), The Crumb Trail by Gina Moxley (Forum Freies Theater Düsseldorf, 2008) and The **Rehearsal:** Playing the Dane after William Shakespeare (Ulster Bank Dublin Theatre Festival, 2010). He appeared in various film and television productions such as When Harvey Met Bob (Direction: Nicholas Renton, 2010), Ripper Street (Direction: Tom Shankland, 2012), Foyle's War (Direction: Stuart Orme, 2013), Crisis Eile: Das Boot (Direction: Charlie McCarthy, 2013) and A Thousand Times Good Night (Direction: Erik Poppe, 2013).

Ben is co-artistic director and co-founder of the Irish theatre group Dead Centre. Co-author and co-director of various Dead Centre productions such as **LIPPY** (Dublin Fringe Festival, 2013), **Chekhov's First Play** (Dublin Theatre Festival, 2015) and **Hamnet** (2017, a co-production of Dead Centre and Abbey Theatre). Other productions as a director include **Spring Awakening** by Frank Wedekind in a new adaptation by Anya Reis (Headlong Theatre, UK, 2014) and **In the Night Time** by Nina Segal (Gate Theatre, London, 2016).
