



[Boston, MA—December 7, 2017] ArtsEmerson, Boston's leading presenter of contemporary world theatre, proudly welcomes Chicago-based Manual Cinema's Ada/Ava - a tale of life and death between twin sisters tending a New England lighthouse – told through a multi-media artistic lens of live-action cinema, shadow puppetry and theatre. The production runs for one week only, January 10 through 14, 2018 at the Emerson Paramount Center's Robert J. Orchard Stage, located at 559 Washington Street in Downtown Boston. Delightfully gothic, beautiful and emotionally complex, **Ada/Ava** utilizes special effect techniques from the early age of cinema — shadow puppetry, live-action silhouettes and overhead projection — to conjure a magic spell of multimedia storytelling, complete with a live musical score. Driven by innovation, the masterful technicians of Chicago-based Manual Cinema are one of the hottest rising ensembles in America, with audiences marveling at their creations even as their methods are plainly revealed.

Beside a lighthouse somewhere on the New England coastline, twin sisters tend to the tower's guiding light and to each other, until Ava unexpectedly dies. Here, the unrestrained imagination moves the melancholy act of mourning through of journey across the thresholds of life and death.

"Manual Cinema is one of the fastest rising young companies in the country at the moment," shares ArtsEmerson Artistic Director David Dower, "and we're delighted to be letting Boston audiences in on the fun. Ada/Ava is actually part of a cluster of work this season that explores the startling versatility and imagination of the many artists around the world working in the intersection of performance and film. Alongside this season's **Torrey Pines** and **In Cold Blood**, and in the tradition of **Kiss & Cry** and **Historia de Amor**, these Chicago artists are blurring the lines between the disciplines in ways that surprise and charm in equal measure. Plus, with a story set in a lighthouse, Manual Cinema's Ada/Ava tells a tale tailor made for New England audiences."

Manual Cinema is a performance collective, design studio, and film/ video production company founded in 2010 by Drew Dir, Sarah Fornace, Ben Kauffman, Julia Miller, and Kyle Vegter. Manual Cinema combines handmade shadow puppetry, cinematic techniques, and innovative sound and music to create immersive visual stories for stage and screen. Using vintage overhead projectors, multiple screens, puppets, actors, live feed cameras, multi-channel sound design, and a live music ensemble, Manual Cinema transforms the experience of attending the cinema and imbues it with liveness, ingenuity, and theatricality. To date Manual Cinema has created five original feature length live cinematic shadow puppet shows (*Lula Del Ray, ADA/ AVA, Mementos Mori, My Soul's Shaodow, The Magic City*); a live cinematic contemporary dance show created for family audiences in collaboration with Hubbard Street

Dance and the choreographer Robyn Mineko Williams (*Mariko's Magical Mix*); an original site-specific installations (*La Celestina*); an original adaptation of *Hansel & Gretel* created for the Belgian Royal Opera; music videos for Sony Masterworks, Gabriel Kahane, three time Grammy Award-winning eighth blackbird, and *New York Times* best-selling author Reif Larson; a live non-fiction piece for *Pop-Up Magazine*; a self-produced short film (Chicagoland); a museum exhibit created in collaboration with the Chicago History Museum (*The Secret Lives of Objects*) a collection of cinematic shorts in collaboration with poet Zachary Schomburg and string quartet Chicago Q Ensemble (*FJORDS*); and live cinematic puppet adaptations of StoryCorps stories (*Show & Tell*).
