"'Mala' means 'bad.' Not that you have done something bad," Lopez writes, "but that you are, in your core, bad." Grounded in Lopez's distinctive emotional language and sharp humor, **Mala** is an utterly unsentimental journey of how to cope and survive a mother's final act of dying. This powerful onewoman show by and featuring Cuban American Melinda Lopez transports us into a world which is uniquely first-generation American in its specifics, and universal in its power. Inspired by true events,

Mala forces us to confront the inevitable finality of our last moments with the people who raised us. Rather than depict a "right way", the play opens the door for conversation in our universal struggle to support those we love in dying, especially when all we've ever known in life is how to survive. "Mala is such a moving and humorous play, says ArtsEmerson co-artistic director P. Carl, "from the first time we heard Melinda read a first draft out loud, we knew we wanted to produce it, to offer it as a true gift to any audience member who has, or ever will, care for a dying loved one—in other words, a play for just about everyone. Melinda said this recently 'plays are about people who do extraordinary things. But the most ordinary thing you can do is die. Right? Everyone does. And the second most ordinary thing is to bear witness.' Melinda is such an important playwriting voice nationally, and truly a local treasure to Boston, it's a joy to premiere her play at ArtsEmerson."

When asked about naming the play "Mala", Lopez shared "the truth is as funny as it is hard, and I'm not interested in seeing people be successful at being good. It is liberating to return to the solo performance format," says Lopez. "After creating a dozen new plays both in Boston and across the country, ArtsEmerson is exactly the right place for this visceral piece. The Boston community is where I find friends, family, mentors, and inspiration every day."

"Melinda has really captured the sense of bewilderment and loss of identity that comes with the territory of caring for loved ones during their transitions," says ArtsEmerson co-artistic director David Dower. "She captures all the vulnerability and fallibility, all the comedy and heartbreak--and ultimately the resilience both of the dying and their caretakers. Anyone who has stood in the eye of this hurricane will recognize its truths instantly. When she first read it I was laughing and crying right along with her, and my personal experience seemed to meld right into hers."
